



## History

The Department of Aquatic Resources Management (DARM) was originally founded after the integration of the Division of Fishery Biology and Department of Hydrobiology in 1981. These two sections were originally created at the same time with FFMS in 1963. The DARM has administratively reinforced through the Decree of the Ministry of Education No. 0546/1983 (see EXHIBIT 9) and reinstated through the Decree of the Ministry of Education and Culture No. 0110/0/1985 (see EXHIBIT 10).

The DARM is composed of three divisions, namely the Division of Aquatic Productivity and Aquatic Environment, Division of Eco-Biology and Aquatic Resource Conservation, and Division Fishery Resource Management. These three divisions are based on scientific group to build the knowledge and competency on the management of aquatic environment, aquatic resources and governance (APPENDIX A).

The DARM manages both undergraduate and post-graduate programs. The undergraduate program is administering one bachelor degree under the name of the Study Program of Aquatic Resource Management (SP-ARM, hereafter). The Post-Graduate level has 2 study programs, i.e. the Coastal and Marine Resource Management (founded in 1996) and Aquatic Science (validated de jure in 1993 but specialized in 2001). Both programs available for master and doctoral degree (APPENDIX A).
